

MISSION OF THE MONTH

THE HEALING PLACE (January): Thanks to everyone who has already contributed this month to The Healing Place. Recently there has been a need for more single beds and they have been added. What is now needed are sheets, pillowcases, and blankets for the single beds. Anyone who wishes to make a contribution that is the greatest area of need at this time. UNITED CRESCENT HILL MINISTRIES (February): Our next mission of the month is United Crescent Hill Ministries, which serves approximately 3,500 individuals in the Crescent Hill, Clifton, Clifton Heights, and Butchertown neighborhoods with a range of programs that includes: emergency financial and food assistance, youth programming, health prevention services, senior citizen activities, community development and organizing, ecumenical activities, outreach, referral and advocacy. They need non-perishable food items and hygiene products for their community pantry, including: canned chicken & tuna, tomato sauce, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned soup, hand/dish soap, shampoo, tooth paste & brushes, laundry detergent, and toilet paper. Please drop items off in the Mission Closet on Sundays or during church hours. Thank you!

PROTOCOL & UPDATE: Second's Re-opening Task Group, consistent with CDC and presbytery guidelines, emphasizes that regardless of vaccination status, wearing masks while gathering inside the church is strongly encouraged. Masking, while important for your own protection, is also an additional layer of protection for those around you, especially unvaccinated children and those who are at risk due to age or medical conditions. Masks are required in Weekday School spaces. Due to rising infection rates brought by the omicron variant, the task group recommends no changes in protocol at this time. We had hoped to adjust masking protocols beginning this Sunday, January 2nd, but in an email discussion on Thursday the group unanimously recommended we continue current policy. They, and all the leadership of this congregation, are grateful for your understanding and patience as, together, we seek to be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ in an uncertain and anxious time.


