Because we long for what is familiar and comfortable, we have difficulty honoring the stranger as a sacred guest who bears the face of Christ.


Worn out and irritated by the work we think we must do, we miss opportunities to receive the gifts that such guests offer us.

MISSION OF THE MONTH: UNITED CRESCENT HILL MINISTRIES

Our February mission of the month is United Crescent Hill Ministries, which serves approximately 3,500 individuals in the Crescent Hill, Clifton, Clifton Heights, and Butchertown neighborhoods with a range of programs that includes: emergency financial and food assistance, youth programming, health prevention services, senior citizen activities, community development and organizing, ecumenical activities, outreach, referral and advocacy. They need non-perishable food items and hygiene products for their community pantry, including: canned chicken & tuna, tomato sauce, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned soup, hand/dish soap, shampoo, tooth paste & brushes, laundry detergent, and toilet paper. Please drop items off in the Mission Closet on Sundays or during church hours. Thank you!

A TREMENDOUS THANKS FROM THE HEALING PLACE

January's Mission of the Month was a huge success due to the extreme generosity of our church. Personal care items and 32 sets of twin sheets have been delivered to the Detox Centers for both women and men. For many of the clients, this was the first time in many months they have been able to experience clean sheets and personal care items. Second Church is one of the first places the staff at The Healing Place knows they can turn to when urgent needs arise.

PROTOCOL UPDATE: While positivity rates are dropping significantly, they are still dangerously high. The Re-Opening Task Group continues to make the well-being of our most vulnerable population its top priority. We will monitor numbers closely in coming weeks and review protocols in early March. In the meantime, we thank you for your patience and faithfulness to the needs of others and strongly encourage the wearing of masks for all indoor church events regardless of your vaccination status. Masking, while important for your own protection, is also an additional layer of protection for those around you, especially unvaccinated children and those who are at risk due to age or medical conditions. Masks are required in Weekday School spaces.

35 Praise Ye the Lord, the Almighty



This very strong 17th-century German hymn employs many phrases from the psalms, especially Psalms 150 and 103:1–6. It did not receive an effective English translation until the mid-19th century, but has remained popular ever since, thanks in part to its stirring tune.

182 I Heard the Voice of Jesus Say



Each stanza here pairs an invitation from Jesus with a response from the narrator. These three invitations recall how Jesus welcomed those who were heavy laden (Matthew 11:28), offered living water (John 4:10–14), and identified himself as the light of the world (John 8:12, 9:5).
