COVID PROTOCOL UPDATE

The church's Re-opening Task Group met Thursday, March 3, to assess masking protocols in response to COVID-19. Noting the rapidly declining infection rates and the current CDC guidelines, the Group, on behalf of Session, has determined that we officially observe a mask-optional policy regarding gatherings inside the building. As an act of our caring for all our community at Second, it is important that we honor the decisions of all our members to mask or not, especially for those who are at risk or most vulnerable. Adults coming into the Weekday School area during its operating hours will still be asked to wear a mask.

The Task Group, composed of active elders, at-large members, and members of the church staff, have faithfully met over the past 16 months or more to evaluate our church's response to the pandemic.


