Reflections

Parsing verbs, vocabulary quizzes, flashcards, grammar books, and dictionaries were the things that filled my first summer while in seminary. I remember it all quite clearly. I had been out of school for several years and suddenly, in the first week of July, I found myself studying for hours everyday and annoyed at these "young kids" who seemed to already know everything in my summer Greek class.

Then, one Friday afternoon Joy said, "I think the Jersey Shore is only an hour away! Bring your flashcards and study at the beach with me today." I remember feeling like I couldn't get away, like I needed to double down and study even harder- not go to the beach!

I had left my job, Joy had quit her job, we had moved away from all our friends so I could go to seminary. I had to do a good job; it had to be worth it! She continued asking and eventually I relented, and we went to the shore.

I remember sitting on the beach doing vocabulary cards between enjoying the cooling waves of the ocean. I remember the relief of letting go of the stress and the desire to achieve and simply being in that moment. Friday afternoons at the shore became a tradition that summer and then again when I took summer Hebrew. What I learned that summer was to receive the gift of Sabbath. In Exodus, God gives the Israelites the law and reminding them of creation, and the seventh day when God rested the law says, "This is what the Lord has commanded, 'tomorrow is to be a day of sabbath rest, a holy sabbath to the Lord." My prayer for us this summer is that we would all experience moments of this sabbath rest.

The interesting thing about sabbath is that it is something we receive not something we create or make for ourselves. I can't make sabbath; I receive sabbath because it is a gift of God. It is a grace that is conferred upon us; not something we make for ourselves.

Whenever I think of sabbath, true restful, renewing sabbath, I go back to that shore and the waves that crash over and over without stopping. That is sabbath, that is God's grace. It crashes upon us whether we deserve it or not and it never stops.

So, this summer may you receive God's sabbath, God's grace in new and profound ways. I challenge all of us to be willing to stop and receive this gift of sabbath grace.

April was an outstanding month. Pledge income of \$178,026 was almost twice the five-year monthly average of \$92,315. Coupled with Second Party's net income of \$77,547, the total income of \$313,269 was unusually high.






This story is part memoir, biography, history lesson and a reminder of how important libraries have been in our lives, and how they continue to be gathering places that

Beginning with the devastating fire in the Central Library of Los Angeles in April, 1986, which destroyed or damaged more than a million books, she introduces an arson investigation, book restoration procedures and eccentric characters. For example, one Chief Librarian, so determined to improve the tastes of citizens in Los Angeles, had warning labels printed, as follows: "This book is of the worst class that we can possibly



keep in the library. We are sorry that you have not any better sense than to read it." He was dissuaded from placing the labels however!




