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#### The Body of Christ

Somos el cuerpo de Cristo, We are the body of Christ. Traemos su santo mensaje. We come to bring the Good News to the world.

We sang these words several times during the annual Montreat Youth Conference, then again while visiting our partners in Tres Rios Presbyterian Church in Costa Rica, and once more while at Presbyterian Youth Triennium at Purdue University. I have been reflecting on them all summer long and asking the question; what does it mean to be the "body of Christ?" Paul uses this metaphor multiple times throughout his letters to describe the church; that we are the hands and feet of Christ, that we are literally Christ's body for the world. We are reminded of this during our communion liturgy that as we partake in this meal, we are sent out to be Christ's body for the world, that all may know and experience Christ's love through us.

This idea began to take on new meaning for me as I sang this simple hymn in all these different contexts. First at Montreat with 1,200 presbyterian youth from all over the southeast and specifically our group of 47 from 2nd Pres. Then, to sing it again but this time with Presbyterians in Costa Rica. The same song, the same melody, the same words and they were just as true. Then finally at Triennium, a gathering of 5,000 youth from all 50 states and over 20 different countries. In each place I began to see Christ's body in new and profound ways. I realized the body of Christ, the Church, is so much bigger than I could ever fully understand. I often hear that people love our congregation because they feel like it is a family, and as I sang these words this summer I began to more fully realize that our "family" is bigger than just 2nd Pres. It expands all over the world and throughout time. We invite you to come be part of this family, this body that stretches over the whole world in new ways this fall. We will have our annual Kick-Off on August 25 after worship to learn about how we are seeking to be Christ's body here, to bring the good news of Christ to our community.

2. The beautiful choral music (and hymn sing during the summer!)


3. The friendly caregivers in the nursery

Faith Formation, Milestones in Ministry by Lorie Williamson, Director of Children's Ministries

"And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, may have power, together with all the Lord's holy people, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God." Ephesians 3:17-19

As with all development, the development of faith is not something that just magically appears. It is a process of consistent nurturing and learning that spans a lifetime. Research has proven that parents are one of the primary influences on building a lasting faith in their children. When this base is provided for a child, it arms them with tools to overcome problems they may not otherwise be able to overcome. Tools such as peace, balance, community and grace.

The Children & Youth Committees have recently formed milestones from birth through high school graduation that will be implemented gradually over the next three years. #### **Costa Rica Mission Trip**

Trip summary written by Elizabeth Scinta

On June 26, nineteen members from 2nd embarked on a journey to San Jose, Costa Rica for a week. Home base was at the Universidad Bíblica Latino Amricana where we stayed for five days. When we were at the university, we learned about immigration in Costa Rica and had morning bible studies with students who attended the university. We had traditional Costa Rican breakfasts and lots of coffee with every meal. We explored downtown San Jose on the first day and visited the National Museum of Costa Rica. We had the opportunity to



spend a special lunch with our former intern Raquel and her grandmother, and had our first meal with the church in Tres Rios, who we would be spending the majority of our time with. The rest of the week we spent at the church where we worked to clean up the garden in the back, re-tile a bathroom, and re-paint a mural on the front of the building. In between those tasks, we were shown around the town and went on multiple home visits where we learned more about the culture and the community. We immersed ourselves into the culture from day one, and did our best to communicate with the people of Tres Rios, even though Spanish wasn't everyones' strong suit. The love we received was overwhelming and immediately made us feel like we were a part of their community. After spending our time in Tres Rios, we made our way to Jaco, Costa Rica for the last two days. On our way to the coast we stopped at Volcán Irazú to explore a coffee farm and to learn about ecological farming. Once we arrived in Jaco we got to spend the last day on the beach, exploring the town, and hanging out with the group. This trip meant a lot to all of us. For some it was a step out of our comfort zone, and for others it was a chance to go back to the community in Tres Rios.

Kentucky Refugee Ministries welcomed Nedal Issam Salaho in the wee hours of the morning on June 28 at Louisville Airport and 2nd Pres began another spiritually enriching adventure with a new friend. KRM has been welcoming refugees from around the world since 1990. The U.S. State Department requires an extensive vetting program for each applicant, which can take up to three years to complete. Church World Service then oversees travel plans to the states and places the refugee in an area with family or

a compatible community of refugees from their home country. KRM is a national model for refugee placement and support. Orientation classes and careful mentoring encourage independence and self reliance within the first three months of arrival.

Nedal arrived with enthusiasm and an appetite for hard work! He wants to gain fluency in English, though his use of the language is already very good. At this point, he is taking advanced English classes at KRM and looks forward to furthering his education. He has a BA in English Literature from a university in Jordan and would like to study Marketing or Finance here. Nedal has a sister, Rawan, who moved to Louisville in 2017. She works full time and has also started a grocery store in the West End. Nedal's dad is Syrian and his mother is Jordanian. They have lived in Jordan for eleven years, after escaping political unrest and violence in Syria. Nedal has a brother also in Jordan who is an engineer. He hopes that all of them may be able to join he and his sister in the U.S. as soon as possible.

Our 2nd Pres family has been preparing for Nedal's arrival since April. Many thanks to those who have given furniture and household goods, set up his apartment, and welcomed him with open hearts! He is already getting a taste of Louisville, even as he spends every day at KRM "learning the ropes". Our amazing planning committee and volunteers have started showing him around town. Kathy Oyler, Ricky

Case, and Larry Sloan have offered TV set up, reading materials, a trip to an Louisville City Football Club (soccer) match, and a dinner out at Mayan Café. If you would like to plan an event with him, please contact Chris Ellis at chris.ellis215@gmail.com or any Mission Committee member and they will get information to you. A helpful note: he observes halal dietary guidelines, so if your plans involve food, please no pork or shellfish. Join us as we welcome Nedal and make him part of our community! We are all God's family and this is a "tent of Abraham" moment. We welcome those who come for refuge.


**BOOK NOTES**


#### **Sisters in Spirit**


