Dear Friends,

Now and then an insight from the field of quantum physics works its way into my consciousness, despite my resistance. I don't claim to have even a rudimentary understanding of quantum physics, but those who do have had a significant impact on contemporary thinking about human relationships and systems. The particular insight that I've been chewing on lately, one that I struggle to accept, is that there really is no such thing as "permanent" from a human point of view. The behavior of the smallest units of matter tells us that what appears to be solid and unchanging is actually continually in flux, and that a particle's identity is altered every time it bounces off another. In other words, nothing stays the same.



What we're talking about here is the "C" word - change. It's a word that leaves a bad taste in most of our mouths. It's a reality that we expend vast amounts of energy trying to prevent, but to no avail. Whole industries are built upon the illusion that we have the power to maintain the status quo, to capture a moment and preserve it forever. The Bible, though, is clear and insistent that change is the norm. In Psalm 90, the psalmist declares, "You (God) turn us back to dust, and say, 'Turn back, you mortals.' You sweep them away; they are like a dream, like grass that is renewed in the morning; in the morning it flourishes and is renewed; in the evening it fades and withers." That's not a word that most of us want to hear!

In the past month, we as a church staff have been reeling from the news of impending changes. Chelsea, who provided administrative support and so much more to many of the ministries of our church, announced she was resigning to devote herself to graduate study full time as she pursues her calling in life. She and her family will still be part of the life of this church as members. Beth, a wizard with details and organization, announced that she was resigning to take a position with St. Vincent de Paul doing what she loves most. Then, of course, Nathan announced that he was taking a call to be pastor of a church in Salt Lake City, Utah, serving a multi-cultural congregation that offers him exciting opportunities to use his significant gifts and passions in ministry.

All of these changes are for positive reasons. They're opening doors to exciting ways for our friends to serve, grow and deepen their faith. But, I don't like it. Other members of our strong and gifted staff don't like it. And you probably don't like it, either. How do we respond to such change? Perhaps to grudgingly accept that life is a flowing, evolving adventure. Perhaps to abandon the denial and the wishing that it weren't so and to pause to give thanks for the gift of such colleagues and friends and the time we've had together, how they have enriched our lives in countless ways. Perhaps to entrust them to the gracious providence of God as they continue their journeys. And, perhaps, to live in the trust and confidence that though change is a constant and often troubling reality, we are beloved children of the God who is "from everlasting to everlasting," whose "steadfast love endures forever." We are sisters and brothers of Jesus Christ who "is the same yesterday and today and forever," the one who promises to be with us "always, to the end of the age."

Mission of the Month: Haiti



Friends, for September's Mission of the Month your Mission Committee has chosen two organizations that help Haiti.



The first is our longtime mission partner, **Women's Global Cancer Alliance (WGCA)**. Our member, Melinda Mast, and her husband, Dr. Robert Hilgers, have worked hard for over ten years to help women in Haiti with this clinic. It specializes in finding and treating cervical cancer. In our country, women rely on both the PAP Smear test and the HPV vaccination. In Haiti, PAP Smear tests are too expensive for 99% of the population and there is no HPV vaccination available. As a result Haiti has the highest rate of deaths caused by cervical cancer in the Western Hemisphere. The clinic uses a method call "See and Treat" which uses inexpensive white vinegar to paint the cervix. A scope is introduced to biopsy any tissue that turns white.

This clinic is staffed by two dedicated nurses who have kept the doors open in spite of civil unrest, economic chaos with the Haitian currency, the assassination of the president, and the earthquake and hurricane that just have occurred. The cost to test and examine one patient is \$35. We have suggested in the past that you consider donations in multiples of \$35 and that has been very successful. Please make your check out to Second Presbyterian Church and in the Memo line of the check write "WGCA Test Kit." You should also be able to go to the church website and make donations online using that method.



The second is the **Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA)**, which is already helping in the disaster areas.

The scale of the disaster facing Haiti after the Aug. 14 earthquake is becoming clearer. The quake and its aftershocks have left almost 1,500 people dead, thousands more injured and an unknown number of people still missing. At least 13,000 homes were destroyed, and roads, bridges, and communication systems have been severely damaged. This catastrophe comes on top of Haiti's ongoing struggles with endemic hunger and poverty, COVID-19 and continuing civil unrest, and as tropical storms continue to bear down on the region.

Presbyterian Disaster Assistance (PDA) is providing emergency relief and short-term recovery in the impacted areas through our established local partners and in collaboration with ACT Alliance and its members. The PC(USA), through PDA and regional World Mission colleagues, will remain active throughout the entire recovery process, accompanying our partners in the area as they determine long-term program needs and providing financial support for rebuilding and resilience.

The needs for the response will be great. God's people are once again called on to stand in the "GAP" – Give. Act. Pray.

At the August 12, 2021, stated Session meeting held in a hybrid format, in-person and via Zoom:

University of Louisville medical students are working with Christopher 2X to combat patterns of violence by encouraging youth affected by violence to become future healers. Speakers will be Christopher 2X and the family of Christian Gwynn. Christian was killed at age 19 in a drive-by shooting while walking home with a friend December 1, 2019. Also speaking will be Christian's sister Victoria, who was shot in the leg on June 7, 2021, about 6:30 p.m. while in Ballard Park in the Smoketown neighborhood. Victoria was with a friend who was also shot, but the friend did not survive. The police said 170 bullets flew through the park that evening. Victoria is now a volunteer with Future Healers.
