Care for the Caregiver

Are you helping a loved one with impairments related to aging, disability, or a mental disorder? Are you taking care of someone who has a chronic illness, managing medications, or taking care of household chores, meals, healthcare for someone who cannot perform these tasks alone? If you answered yes to any of these, then you are a caregiver.

Caregivers hold it all together or have the overwhelming feeling that they must hold it together because no one else can. Caring

for your loved one can lead to isolation, depression, chronic health issues, and poor quality of life. The Deacons here at Second see how important it is to support its members who hold the role of caregiver.

The caregiver support group meets the second Monday of each month at 4 p.m. These remote monthly Zoom meetings provide resources, education, guest speakers, and a safe space for support and assistance in finding solutions to the challenges of caregiving.

Mission

Our mission of the month is The Healing Place

The Healing Place continues to be a beacon of hope to those women and men hopelessly addicted to drugs and alcohol. It serves a million meals yearly and has room to care for 1,000 clients across 3 campuses. There is no charge to clients and the majority remain there for at least 8–9 months before they are able to return to society. Everyone has a job to keep the facility running making the overhead only \$33 a day per client to be in the program. There



is a long-term recovery program, detox, VA program, department of corrections program, intensive outpatient program (which provides free housing), sober living, aftercare programs, long-term overnight programs, homeless outreach program, and housing contracts for people who need it.

Needed items include self-care items such as **deodorant**, **shampoo**, **toiletries**, **shaving**, **hygiene**, **etc**. Please mark if your bag is for males or females. Since clients are outdoors walking to classes anything to help keep them warm in the cold would be well used: **gloves**, **hats. coats**, **and scarves** would all be great. Thanks for your generosity!





Boaz recognizes her faithfulness to her husband's family and calls her ishah chayil or "worthy wife." The child of Ruth and Boaz is named Obed, meaning



"servant." In the women's song of praise, the child born to Naomi's daughter-in-law becomes the redeemer, restorer of the family. The story of Ruth illustrates God working through ordinary women and men, with all their faults and failings, for extraordinary purposes. The end of the Book of Ruth points towards King David.




