Family through Baptism

Mark 1:9-11

⁹ About that time, Jesus came from Nazareth of Galilee, and John baptized him in the Jordan River. ¹⁰ While he was coming up out of the water, Jesus saw heaven splitting open and the Spirit, like a dove, coming down on him. ¹¹ And there was a voice from heaven: “You are my Son, whom I dearly love; in you I find happiness.”

Why are we Baptized?

- To become a member of the larger family of the church. The whole congregation makes promises to support the one being baptized. They all promise to help the family raise a child in the church and knowing Christ.

What is Baptism?

- Baptism is a visible symbol of God's love. It is something we can see and remember how much God loves us.
- It is a celebration of belonging to God and a community of faith. The way in which someone is welcomed into the Christian community and becomes a member of the church

How are you Baptized?

- If a baby, water is poured or sprinkled on head
- If older person may be immersed or dunked into water
- Water reminds us of being clean, giving nourishment and helping grow.

 - The pastor pours water on our heads with their hands, a cup or a shell to remind us God's love cleans us when we sin or do things that are wrong, gives us nourishment and helps us grow.
