**CHILDCARE:** Childcare is available in room 117 for children ages 5 and under during 9:00 Worship and for children ages 3 and under for the 11:00 Worship. Room 117 is in Hilbert Hall, adjacent to the Weekday School Atrium, entrance #1 or #9.

Parents may pick up their children from the lower-level educational space after 11:00 Worship has ended. Educational space is best accessed through the double doors near the Narthex marked 2PK. PreK – 3rd grades rooms 150-154. 4th & 5th grades – room 180.

KidCheck is a secure children’s check-in system that enhances your provider’s security system and simplifies the check-in process. KidCheck helps ensure no one can pick up your child without your consent. Signing up for KidCheck is easy and free for parents, guardians, and workers! Visit <https://go.kidcheck.com> or download the KidCheck app on an iOS or Android device. Stations can be found at the nursery outside Hilbert Hall and in the Common Space near door 6. For you and your child/ren’s safety, beginning today, all doors except for door 3 and the main Sanctuary doors will be locked at 11:15. Please use one of these entrances if you will be arriving after this time.

## **MISSION OF THE MONTH: THE HEALING PLACE**

The Healing Place continues to be a beacon of hope to women and men hopelessly addicted to drugs and alcohol. This important mission partner serves a million meals yearly and has room to care for 1,000 clients across 3 campuses. There is no charge to clients and the majority remain there for at least 8-9 months before they are able to return to society. Everyone has a job to keep the facility running making the overhead only \$33 a day per client to be in the program. There is a long-term recovery program, detox, VA program, department of corrections program, intensive outpatient program (which provides free housing) sober living, aftercare programs, long-term overnight programs, homeless outreach program and housing contracts for people who need it.

We are collecting items during the month of January most needed by The Healing Place: deodorant, shampoo, toiletries, shaving products, hygiene products, etc. Please specify on the bag whether the items are for male or female. Additionally, clients are outdoors frequently walking to classes, so anything to help them stay warm will be well used such as the following: gloves, hats, coats, and scarves. Please drop off in the mission closet during church office hours or on Sundays. Thank you for your generosity!

**PROTOCOL & UPDATE:** Second's Re-opening Task Group, consistent with CDC and presbytery guidelines, emphasizes that regardless of vaccination status, wearing masks while gathering inside the church is strongly encouraged. Masking, while important for your own protection, is also an additional layer of protection for those around you, especially unvaccinated children and those who are at risk due to age or medical conditions. Masks are required in Weekday School spaces.

Due to rising infection rates brought by the omicron variant, the task group recommends no changes in protocol at this time. We had hoped to adjust masking protocols beginning this Sunday, January 2nd, but in an email discussion on Thursday the group unanimously recommended we continue current policy. They, and all the leadership of this congregation, are grateful for your understanding and patience as, together, we seek to be faithful disciples of Jesus Christ in an uncertain and anxious time.
