MISSION OF THE MONTH: UNITED CRESCENT HILL MINISTRIES

Our February mission of the month is United Crescent Hill Ministries, which serves approximately 3,500 individuals in the Crescent Hill, Clifton, Clifton Heights, and Butchertown neighborhoods with a range of programs that includes: emergency financial and food assistance, youth programming, health prevention services, senior citizen activities, community development and organizing, ecumenical activities, outreach, referral and advocacy. They need non-perishable food items and hygiene products for their community pantry, including: canned chicken & tuna, tomato sauce, peanut butter, macaroni & cheese, canned soup, hand/dish soap, shampoo, tooth paste & brushes, laundry detergent, and toilet paper. Please drop items off in the Mission Closet on Sundays or during church hours. Thank you!

PROTOCOL UPDATE: While positivity rates are dropping significantly, they are still dangerously high. The Re-Opening Task Group continues to make the well-being of our most vulnerable population its top priority. We will monitor numbers closely in coming weeks and review protocols in early March. In the meantime, we thank you for your patience and faithfulness to the needs of others and strongly encourage the wearing of masks for all indoor church events regardless of your vaccination status. Masking, while important for your own protection, is also an additional layer of protection for those around you, especially unvaccinated children and those who are at risk due to age or medical conditions. Masks are required in Weekday School spaces.

FREE VACCINATION CLINIC AT SECOND

LouVax Mobile is hosting a COVID-19 vaccine clinic at Second on **Saturday, Feb. 26, 10:00 a.m.–1:00 p.m.** The clinic will offer free COVID-19 vaccines (first, second, and booster doses). Moderna and Pfizer vaccines will be available to those who are eligible. See Seconds to Go for a link to make an appointment; walk-ins are also welcome.

Residents ages 5 and older are eligible to be vaccinated. A parent or guardian must be present for anyone under the age of 12. Parental or guardian consent can be given for individuals ages 12–17. You do not need insurance, a social security number, or an ID. Medical staff will be available on site to address questions or concerns about the vaccines. 
