The Lord Is My Refuge: Reflections on Covid: This evening, November 15, 2020, 7 p.m. - 8:30 p.m. on Zoom. You are invited to join together for an evening of sharing where God's Spirit was present in the midst of the current pandemic and how God can be our 'refuge and strength' in times of trouble. We will hear from members of our congregation who are survivors of the virus and essential health care workers about where they saw God and how their experience with Covid-19 has and is still shaping their faith.
