**About the Anthem** "Prayers in Time of Distress": British composer Philip Moore set the prayers of Dietrich Bonhoeffer written during his incarceration in Nazi Germany. This particular setting uses a "tritone," an interval between notes that has historically illustrated unsettledness or discord, which these words certainly evoke. Near the end of the prayer is heard the resolution of the discord as the Octet sings in a major key - until the final phrase is sung with that lingering tritone. Moore perfectly captures the tension between our deep trust in God, and our human doubt and anguish.

This hymn comes out of the early 19th-century southern camp meeting experience, where believers were invited to pray for new converts, often likened to biblical characters such as Paul's jailer (Philippians 1:12–13). As its name shows, the five-note tune was created for this text.

# Great Is Thy Faithfulness



\*Or "Great is thy faithfulness, O God, Creator."

Written as a meditation on Lamentations 3:22–23, this text is one of the few hymns among the 1200 poems by this Methodist writer and pastor that has gained much currency. The tune that appears here was composed especially for these words, and the pairing has proved enduring.
