

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OUR MUSIC THIS MORNING: We are honoring our worship heritage as well as our friends in the Jewish faith who are celebrating High Holy Days. Our hymns and anthems reflect traditional worship of the Jewish faith, reminding us of the faithful God who called Abram, and who still calls us today. Our musicians will present a setting of the Silent Devotion ("May the words of my mouth"), and a beautiful setting of Psalm 8, with its opening words, "Adonai, Adonenu," or "O Lord, Our Lord." Our opening hymn is a version of the Jewish hymn Yigdal ("may He be magnified") - a 14th-century poetic summary of the Thirteen Principles of Faith, a medieval theological creed written by the philosopher Maimonides. Its tune LEONI was a transcription of a Sephardic tune by 18th century synagogue chorister Meyer Lyon, and is sung with the Yigdal text often at the end of Shabat (Sabbath) services.
