This Week's Craft

Clover



Take the packet marked “flower” out of your Sunday School Bag. You should have a paper cup, a Styrofoam square, 4 pipe cleaners, 4 pom-poms, a label, and some shredded paper. Extra materials needed are liquid glue and a piece of tape.

- Place a dot of glue on one pom-pom and place on one pipe cleaner. Hold in place until it is dry enough to stay. Repeat with remaining pipe cleaners and pom-poms.
- Tape the label around one of the flower stems.
- Push clovers into the Styrofoam however you would like.
- Place Styrofoam with clovers into cup.
- Place shredded paper on top of Styrofoam in cup.

Treat your clovers with care as you never know how many Whos may live there!!!
