Dear friends,

Two words describe life at Second Presbyterian Church in 2022: change and resilience. Much of the change this past year has come in the area of Church personnel. Like many organizations, we have faced the phenomenon of “the great resignation,” with people’s experience of the pandemic leading them to re-evaluate their lives and priorities. Several of our staff moved on to other opportunities and new directions. I am grateful for the hard work of the Personnel Committee and other staff for bringing to Second gifted and dedicated individuals in the administrative, bookkeeping, and facilities areas of the Church. We also added the Technology Coordinator position. Rich Gianzero served faithfully and ably as Interim Associate Pastor and will be heading to another call when our installed Associate Pastor arrives. Sam Libra settled in this past year as our outstanding Organist and Worship Assistant.

Another change nearly every church now faces is the “new normal” of church life with lower in-person participation in worship as well as other large gatherings and moving more to “hybrid” meetings and classes with both in-person and virtual participation. Our average worship attendance compares favorably to previous years in counting online worshippers. Thanks to your generosity, our technology upgrades provide quality experiences for those watching online, overseen by Elliott Nichols and Evan Vivic, our worship technology team.

Through the determination of this church’s people and leadership and the gift of the Holy Spirit moving among us, this church has exhibited great resilience in the face of change and challenges. Bucking a trend, the numbers and amounts of financial pledges to the church increased in 2022 and we ended the year with a small surplus of funds. Mission giving continued strongly and will increase in 2023. We received several new members, including those we welcomed from New Goshen and Calvin Presbyterian Churches, who came to us upon their closings. Our partnership with the Weekday School has grown and strengthened. The music ministry of the Church continues to be of the highest quality. We expect a Director of Children’s Ministries on board early in the new year to relieve Pastor Jordan and our outstanding lay leaders. Our deacons continue to provide faithful care for their flock. Honest and in-depth conversations are taking place about the future of ministry with youth and their families and how best to provide for our young people.

Our mission tagline is “Sharing the grace of God with one another and the world around us.” By the grace of God, such sharing continues to be strong at Second Presbyterian as the work of Jesus Christ is carried out among us and in the world beyond our walls.



Refugee Update

We are currently supporting two Afghan families, the Sultanis and the Amani/Sediqis who are both now at the end of their official sponsorships.

Muska Amani, Toba Sediqi and Karima Amani

The three cousins are doing well and advancing toward independence. Their paperwork is complete, and they will interview for jobs in the next couple weeks. These professional and highly-skilled women arrived in the US with little English. All three take ESL classes regularly at KRM. KRM's ESL classes have been critical, but they need more practice!

Muska Amani, 26, is the youngest of the group. She is the younger sister of Khatul Amiri, the mother of our co-sponsored family from 2020. Khatul Amiri recently passed her driving permit test and is thrilled to learn to drive. This is a big step; she never drove in Afghanistan. She wants to continue her education and work at Walmart with Raees Amiri, her relative.

Toba Sediqi, 28, hopes to work at GE Appliances in the near future. Prior to evacuating Afghanistan, she was a law student and would like to complete her degree here. She recently completed needed dental repairs. She loves volleyball and hopes to be able to play at some point. She is awaiting a job placement through KRM.

Karima Amani, 38, completed a law degree in Kabul and worked in IT for the Ministry of Defense. She recently completed dental work as well. When her English is stronger, there will be many more options for her job placement. For now, though, she hopes to be placed at GE Appliances. The benefits and hours are attractive, plus it is easy to get there by bus.

The Sultani family

The Sultani family managed to escape Afghanistan as it fell to the Taliban in August 2021. They spent almost a year in a military camp in Qatar and arrived in Louisville on September 9, 2022, with a toddler, two young boys, and a couple of suitcases.

Subhaan, 31, the father, was an interpreter for the US military, which qualifies him for a Special Immigrant Visa. This SIV status will expedite his green card, which he expects any day, and also entitles him to a few extra funds and benefits. He is the provider for his immediate family here and the sole provider for his widowed mother, sister, and younger brother still in Kabul. Subhaan now works in production at GE. He passed his driver's test and is saving to purchase a car.


Shabina, 25, the mother, is working on her English via online ESL courses provided by KRM and is studying for her driver's permit test.

Daughter Shukrana, 2, was eight months old when her family escaped Kabul. She is full (FULL) of energy. Her brothers Rehan, 6, and Shukran, 5, enjoy school and are adjusting well.

This family is healing and adjusting as well as could be expected. Subhaan told us, "It is terrible to lose all your dreams and all your goals, all your money, and your home."


Presbyterian Union

Care for the Caregiver
