formal, even archaic, to modern ears. But there is a long history of discernment among people of faith, both Jewish and Christian. The root of the word means "to sift through" and describes a process of careful and intentional listening, paying attention to what the Spirit might be saying to us right now. Discernment involves "sifting through" the many options, distractions and competing voices in our lives to discover the main thing that remains, the directions we are to take, the words we are to hear, to be faithful to the God of Jesus Christ. There are various approaches to discernment but, finally, it is a gift we ask the Lord

to give us, not an accomplishment.

Speak, LORD, for your servant is listening... (1 Samuel 3:9)

Dear Friends,

On Sunday, September 10, we will begin a sermon series entitled, "Sifting Through: Biblical Images of Discernment." This series will coincide with a discernment process that the church's ruling body, the session, is just now beginning. During recent discussion of several issues in the life of the church, the session realized that we can't faithfully deal with these issues as separate concerns. We as a congregation need clarity of direction and a better sense of the "big picture" into which various possibilities and challenges fit. They have committed to such intentional and careful listening over the next 4-5 months, including an all-day retreat in September.

The word "discernment" doesn't get much airtime these days. It sounds overly

It is my conviction that making discernment the focus of proclamation in worship for a season will help all of us get involved with faithful listening to the Spirit's prompting, not only regarding this church's future but our individual lives, as well. What do we value? What is worth sacrificing and risking for? What are God's priorities? What gifts has God given us and how are we to use them, here and now? If we cannot be "all things to all people," on what are we being asked to focus our resources? Such questions are part of what the apostle Paul calls "discerning the Sprit."

Below are the preaching texts for the seven Sundays of this series. I encourage you to read these biblical texts prior to each Sunday and to give them prayerful consideration before joining others in worship either in person or online. Discernment, whether corporate or individual, isn't a task for the isolated individual, but for the gathered community.

Refugee Committee Update

We are excited to announce that our next family will arrive in October, and we are eager to welcome, house, feed, and nurture them! Working alongside Kentucky Refugee Ministries (KRM) the goal is to help the family reach self-sufficiency as soon as possible.

As you may have heard, there have been some staff changes at KRM with the departure of Maha Kolko a few months ago. We are pleased to now be working with Joseph Caminiti, Co-Sponsorship and Volunteer Engagement Manager, to coordinate the arrival of our new family. Along with staff changes, there have also been procedural changes at KRM that we were made aware of during our training meeting with Joseph. We now have to submit a few more forms, log volunteer hours, and teach our families how to navigate the TARC bus system.

Since 2018, our church has sponsored eight refugee families, four from Afghanistan, two from the Democratic Republic of Congo and one each from Sudan and Syria. We were also one of the few to sponsor families during the Covid pandemic.

Kentucky native Lisabeth Tabor Hughes graduated from The University of Louisville with a B.A. (summa cum laude in 1977) and from the University's School of Law with a J.D (magna sum laude in 1980) where she was Executive Editor of the school's Law Review and named outstanding graduate. When in private practice, she handled a variety of business and commercial litigation in both state and federal courts. Justice Hughes has served on the Kentucky Court of Appeals (1997-1998; 2006), Jefferson County Circuit Court (1999-2007), and the Kentucky Supreme Court (2007- January 1, 2023). In 2017, Justice Hughes was named deputy chief justice. She retired on January 1, 2023. Former President Obama said of Justice Hughes, "[she] has a long and impressive record of service and a history of handing down fair and judicious decisions."

A Note From House and Gardens

Have You Seen The Memorial Garden?



In response to an expressed desire for a memorial garden, in May of 2016, Steve Jester, pastor, appointed a task force consisting of a representative from the Congregational Care Committee, the Property Committee, and the Worship Committee. These three committees reported back to session in July 2016 for approval of their plans. The House and Gardens Committee was asked to work with local specialists to bring the design to fruition.

Long-time members, Elizabeth and Dick Clay, graciously donated funds to establish our memorial garden. And we were blessed that our own beloved member and gifted landscape designer, Mary Webb, shared her expertise with us for the last time. During 2017, shrubs were planted, irrigation was installed, benches were purchased and secured, and bronze plaques were made to order.

The Memorial Garden was created:

To proclaim God's gracious love in Christ Jesus for all people, to provide a meaningful place for the remains of our members and their families, and to provide a contemplative place of solace for those who grieve.

To date, the ashes of 10 members/families have been scattered here, and several members have reserved locations on the memorial wall. The next time you approach the sanctuary, take a minute to look to your right (next to the steps) and notice our Memorial Garden, a garden for prayer, contemplation, and meditation.
