A Message from;

John Odom, General Prebyter with Mid-Kentucky Presbytery

Ever since Elijah passed his prophetic mantle to Elisha as he was taken up into the heavens by fiery chariots and horsemen (2 Kings 2), God has provided for leadership transitions for God's people.

Second Presbyterian Church finds itself in a season of leadership transitions with both the retirement of head-of-staff pastor, Steve Jester, in June, and the imminent departure of associate pastor for faith formation and mission, Jordan Akin, as she follows a new call to hospital chaplaincy.

Mid-Kentucky Presbytery's Commission on Ministry has appointed Rev. Mark Baridon, pastor of Briargate, and Elder Robert Charles, Peace Presbyterian Church, to work directly with you throughout the process of finding new pastoral leadership. This transitional process can be lengthy—averaging at least one month of transition for every year of the prior pastor's service.

The length of the process is due to several factors:

- First, the congregation needs significant time to work through five distinct and necessary developmental tasks of the interim period: coming to terms with history and processing emotions; discovering a new identity apart from the former pastor; allowing and empowering new leadership; renewing linkages with the presbytery and denomination; and commitment to new leadership and a new future.
- Second, the potential pool of experienced, large-membership head-of-staff pastors and experienced associate pastors is relatively limited.
- Third, there is vetting of all potential candidates in a variety of ways.

Although the above process may appear overly slow and protracted, there are several immediate actions that can propel you on your journey, let me suggest:

- Trust that God has uniquely brought the specific constellation of pastors, staff and congregation at Second for such a time as this, and that God uses those called for the blessing of the church and the world.
- Look within the congregation for members, leaders, staff, parents to step up in new and creative ways, both volunteer and paid. Look outside the congregation to the resources of the presbytery like the wealth of pulpit supply pastors for worship leadership, the presbytery's fall youth retreat for 3rd-5th graders, UKirk for college students and other shared activities. Look to the wisdom of the Commission on Ministry that regularly walks with congregations through transition. We are better sharing ministry together.

The Next Steps in the Interim Process (Continued)

- Support Second's session and personnel committee as they weigh options and discern ways forward with
 a variety of choices that may include some or all of the following— hiring temporary ordained or nonordained staff, searching for an interim associate pastor, or searching for a new called and installed associate
 pastor, or delaying an associate pastor search so that the next head of staff pastor can be part of staff building.
 Each option has pros and cons, and most are not mutually exclusive. That's why faith is a journey and not a recipe.
- Pray without ceasing for the interim/transitional head of staff search committee, that they move from a short list to a finalist who might begin in the near future.
- Keep showing up, turning out, and being the people and the church that Christ is calling you to be, relying on the goodness of God who is the way and the truth and the life.

As Second journeys through the interim period, faithfully commit yourself to the Presbyterian process of new leadership discernment and remember to breathe and live abundantly as Jesus admonishes. While this transition process likely won't conclude with heavenly pyrotechnics, as was the case with Elijah and Elisha, it will bring, in due time, the spark of new pastoral leadership to ignite the spiritual energy of God's people at Second Presbyterian Church.



The Biblical Studies Class will begin a special summer series on Sunday, June 2, 2024. The topic will be "Formation of the Bible." Did you ever wonder how the Bible as we know it was put together? 
