#### Welcoming the Unexpected...

December is so busy that we prefer not to deal with things unexpected! We keep our calendars updated with many details: when to bring out the first decorations... when to get the tree...who's coming or going and when...when to go shopping for gifts and the Christmas dinner grocery items...when music and pageant rehearsals are scheduled...when finals are due at school...when is that neighborhood party? We hope all our Christmas preparations are as orderly as an Advent calendar, where each day a neat door opens, or a flap is lifted one by one in predictable succession.

Yet, our Scripture readings for the Sundays in Advent reveal how unexpected and upending everything was leading up to the most unexpected wonder of all—the birth of Christ. Luke 1 offers two Annunciation stories—the first angel's announcement is to old Zechariah; the second angelic announcement comes to young Mary. Neither Zechariah nor Mary is prepared for the news delivered by Divine Messenger. Later, Mary and Elizabeth clasp each other in their shared surprise at how God has so unexpectedly changed their lives forever. By Christmas Eve, Luke 2 reveals how the orderly world of Quirinius and Augustus will be upended by the unexpected, too. Who could ever have imagined that God would hatch such a plan and be born among us?!

When I was in my early twenties, I had the opportunity to visit Israel with a group of seminarians. If you have also visited the Holy Land, you know that many of the sites have been developed into tourist venues so that it can be hard to feel, to find the simplicity of the stories we associate with them. This is especially true in Bethlehem. By the time we got to Bethlehem, we were seasoned travelers, maybe even jaded travelers to a degree. We rolled our eyes when they told us we could choose to visit the Roman Catholic Shepherds' Field or the Greek Orthodox Shepherds' field. We made our way past countless carvers making Olive Wood Nativity sets at various price points. The church of the Nativity, with its lighted star atop, its marbled floors, and hundreds of hanging oil lamps in shiny metals made it hard to envision a small manger at all. When I finally reached the lower levels of the church and looked into a small marble niche with a fourteen-point star to mark the spot where Jesus was born...I had pretty much had it. As I stood there not feeling the Christmas spirit, a man rushed in, prostrated himself before that star, reaching toward it with tears streaming down his face. He prayed with all of his heart in a language I could not understand yet grasped as deeply spiritual. In that moment, in that crowded place, I welcomed the unexpected. The holiness I had shut out, had missed altogether because of all of the clutter and trappings not just of brass and marble, but the clutter and trappings of my own expectations and judgments, came upon me. This man, like pilgrims through the centuries, had sacrificed much and traveled far to come to this place...to be near, to touch the most amazing and unexpected event of all: the birth of Emmanuel, God-With-Us.

I hope in the midst of all the traditions and details and clutter this season can bring, there will be a moment when the unexpected holiness of it all comes upon you and, in wonder, you bow in prayer and praise.


