I have many books of her poetry, but this quote I discovered only recently and when I read it—it made me catch my breath: "Joy…is not a crumb."

After being with you for a couple of months, I see a congregation focused on various weighty matters: a strategic plan, analysis of the budget and giving patterns, honing job descriptions with changes in the staff, ongoing repairs to building structures, etc. The staff is busy. The Session is busy. Our Committees are hard at work. Like good Protestants, our noses are to the grindstone.

A couple of weeks ago, I began to wonder about something. So, I asked our dedicated staff how this congregation has fun together. Where/how do we collectively feel, experience, express joy? If I asked you that question about Second Presbyterian Church, how would you answer—what would you tell me about?

As November unfolds, the weight of the world is heavy: war in Ukraine, in Gaza and Lebanon continues to destroy lives and landscapes. Communities from Florida to Virginia still recover from devastating hurricanes and flooding. A national election cycle has consumed airwaves and brainwaves for months. Have

we lost the ability to have fun...to find, see, and express joy? I remembered Mary Oliver's phrase, "Joy...is not a crumb." Here is her poem, **Don't Hesitate**:

If you suddenly and unexpectedly feel joy, don't hesitate. Give in to it. There are plenty of lives and whole towns destroyed or about to be. We are not wise, and not very often kind. And much can never be redeemed. Still, life has some possibility left. Perhaps this is its way of fighting



back, that sometimes something happens better than all the riches or power in the world. It could be anything, but very likely you notice it in the instant when love begins. Anyway, that's often the case. Anyway, whatever it is, don't be afraid of its plenty. Joy is not made to be a crumb.

Christians, of all people, know that joy is not a crumb. It is a full loaf, broken and shared. Warm, delicious, nourishing when passed around hand to hand: Take. Eat. Remember. Give thanks—Eucharist! The way we Presbyterians 'do communion' is not often noted for its joy, warmth, and exuberance, yet the theology of it encompasses all three. We are often about serious, weighty things in the church and in our own lives; quite rightly so. But life with God is also meant to be fun, to embody joy. How might we inhabit this joy together more fully? What are some ways we can share joy, have fun within our neighborhood, across the city, and even scatter joy across the world? Don't hesitate. Let's be All In. After all, joy is not made to be a crumb.

# A Message from Stewardship

### **ONE COMMUNITY -- ONE COMMITMENT**

"You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might." -- Jesus (Mark 12:30).

We are a generous congregation. Our generosity enables Second to support numerous mission partners within our community, our country, and around the world. Our outreach provides hope for the poor, the sick, the homeless, the discouraged, the downtrodden, and the destitute. We also support missionaries and sister congregations who spread the Word in other countries where the Bible is all too often challenged, disregarded or disrespected.

Our generosity also enables us to maintain a strong pastoral, music, and administrative staff, which collectively keeps our congregation active and the Word alive and vital, and in so doing, challenges us to become better Christians, better friends and neighbors, better families, better people -- and together, a better community.

And it is our generosity that keeps the heat on in the winter, the air conditioning on (usually) in the summer, the buildings and grounds in satisfactory condition, and the lights on throughout the day.

All of this, of course, takes money, and plenty of it. Fortunately, we have many members of our congregation who give very generously every year, and those contributions provide a much needed foundation for our many church needs and activities.

But as a congregation, we can and should do better. In recent years, barely half of our members make a pledge of any amount, or otherwise contribute, with the result that annual giving has levelled off and even dipped slightly from earlier years. The net result is that some church activities and commitments are potentially jeopardized, including important mission projects.

So this year we are asking that our congregation -- each of us, all of us -- be "ALL IN." We all have limits as to what we can give, but we can all give something. Together we are one community of faith, and with that unity in mind, we are asking that each of us -- all of us -- step up and pledge what we can to support the whole, and to support the mission of the church. For as the Bible says, "Like good stewards of the manifold grace of God, serve one another with whatever gift each of you has received ... so that God may be glorified in all things." 1 Peter 4:10-11.

Things continue to progress for our refugee family. Immaculee and her two sons, Shema and Brian, attend orientation class at Kentucky Refugee Ministries three days a week and continue to adjust to life in Louisville. Immaculee is also attends ESL classes at KRM, and is making great progress with her language skills.

The Refugee team at Second Pres continues to provide support by providing appropriate winter clothing, assisting with occasional transportation, and helping Immaculee solve maintenance issues at her apartment. Recently the team provided a discounted washer and dryer for Immaculee, as her old washer and dryer (which had been donated by KRM) had died. Big thanks go to Ritu Furlan for researching the options, and securing the delivery of what will be a life changing gift for Immaculee!

In the upcoming weeks the team will be planning some outings and fellowship opportunities for the family. We also are looking for volunteers who might be interested in taking the family out for an activity.
