In the Presbyterian pre-school he attended, nearing Mother's Day, the children were invited to draw a picture of their Moms and answer the question: "What Does Mom Do All Day?" The teacher faithfully recorded the answer each child gave. There I am, my head a big round circle, with two straight lines protruding directly down from the circle representing the rest of me. The answer he gave about what I did all day was this: "My Mom is a Presbyterian minister. She works in a church. She goes to meetings."

Isn't that just it?! We Presbyterians have sooo many meetings. It's how we organize and carry out many of our ministries and responsibilities as stewards of all God has entrusted to us. Meetings are important and holy things can happen even though the Agenda before us looks fairly mundane. In my first ten days with you, I have gone to a good share of meetings. This has given me an opportunity to meet more of you, to see how you work together, and to learn what is important to you. My first Session meeting will take place the day after I have written this article. I look forward to gathering with the elders of the church as together we serve through this time of transition. The Finance Committee meeting was full of gratitude for the faithful generosity within this congregation that supports our ministries and mission efforts, keeps the property in good shape, and enables you to have this very gifted and dedicated staff. The Property Committee had its eye on the buildings and the budget and 'bees in the belfry' (perhaps better than bats), which are now gone. The Stephens Ministry group got back together to wonder together how they can listen and support individuals and the congregation and the Deacons through this season of change. I've listened to the staff as they manage everything from doorbells to handbells, pastoral concerns to printed bulletins, coffee to confirmands. The CNC is meeting with prayer and discernment at the forefront as they consider nominations for new officers to serve in three key years before us. I popped in on the Golden Handbells ringers and the Second Act singers making beautiful music that sounds through the hallways.

Thank you for your gracious welcome to me. I look forward to getting to know other committees and groups in the church and each of you as members. We have been given this time to take an intentional look at our life together as it is, to consider how much has changed for all communities of faith and this one in particular since the last time you searched for a Senior Pastor, and to set fresh vision for priorities and possibilities ahead. For our work together, Romans 12:9-18, often called 'Marks of the True Christian,' sets the tone for us. The whole of it is worth a read, but it says this in part: "Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honor. ... be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. ... persevere in prayer. Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. Live in harmony with one another...do not claim to be wiser than you are... take thought for what is noble in the sight of all. If it is possible, so far as it depends upon you, live peaceably with all."



Care for the Caregiver

Are you helping a loved one with impairments related to aging, disability, or a mental disorder? Are you taking care of someone who has a chronic illness, managing medications, or taking care of household chores, meals, and healthcare for someone who cannot perform these tasks alone? If you answered yes to any of these, then you are a caregiver.

Caregivers hold it all together or have the overwhelming feeling that they must hold it together because no one else can. Caring for your loved one can lead to isolation, depression, chronic health issues, and poor quality of life. The Deacons here at Second see how important it is to support its members who hold the role of caregiver.

The caregiver support group meets on the second Monday of each month at 4:00 p.m. these remote monthly Zoom meetings provide resources, education, guest speakers, and a safe space for support and assistance in finding solutions to the challenges of caregiving.
